CLIMATE.

No subject can interest the homeseker more than that of climate. No section of Oregon will bear the scrutiny of close observation or scientific investigation and give so favorable results as Jackson County. In its climate this delightful region has the combined advantages of other sections, without the accompanying drawbacks. It enjoys the warmth of summer and frosts of winter without extremes in either. Having rainfall ample for all purposes it escapes the continued winter rains of the Willamette Valley.

The annual rainfall ranges from 18 to 20 inches averaging about 25 inches

The annual rainfall ranges from 18 to 30 inches, averaging about 25 inches.

The extreme limit of the themometer in summer is 100°, though it seldom reaches 85 degs., while in winter it seldom sinks as low as 10 degs. above zero; the average for winter being about 40 degs. and in summer 69 degs.

Snow falls in winter to the depth of from one to three inches, and occasionally a little thin the state of th deeper, but seldom remains but a few hours or days at most. This is in the

Storms, tornadoes and cyclones, which visit other countries, and scatter death and destruction in their track, are here unknown.
